MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT SANDY KUHLMAN

It's exciting to be able to report on another year of growth and progress for the Western Lane Community Foundation. We've wrapped up our grant cycle, awarded both high school and continuing education scholarships and are beginning to think about 2024 – our 50th anniversary!

This year we are particularly pleased to have completed three major initiatives. We rolled out an online grant platform with the 2023 grant cycle, which updated our grant process and made it more efficient for both applicants and the Foundation Board.

Our second significant initiative was contracting for administrative services to support the Board. While we have historically taken great pride in being an all-volunteer organization, in March, the Board contracted with Jenna Bartlett of Siuslaw Consulting to provide much-needed administrative support. Jenna has embraced the mission of the Foundation, and provided the support needed by our volunteer board to manage a \$10+ million trust with over 90 funds.

Our third special initiative was rebranding and developing a new logo for WLCF's 50th anniversary. We are proud of the image it presents for the Foundation and how it displays our missions from scholarships to our philanthropic giving along with our presence from the coast to the upriver forest.

The 2023 grant cycle was particularly rewarding. Applications were back up to pre-Covid volume and the quality of the applicants was excellent. We were proud to award over \$100,000 in grant funding. A great turnout at the award ceremony hosted by the Rotary Club of Florence made for a super celebration. Thank you to the community that has made all of this possible. Special thanks to the Rotary Club of Florence for its ongoing support.

Over the last couple of years, our scholarship program has grown to equal our grant funding. This year over \$100,000 in scholarships were awarded to both high school graduates and students who are continuing their pursuit of higher education.

In closing, I would like to express my personal appreciation for WLCF and all it does to enhance the quality of life in Western Lane. 2023 will conclude my tenure on the board. During the last six years, I have had the honor and privilege to watch the Foundation grow, to see our impact in the community expand and to help tackle the challenges that have come with that growth. Having spent two years as treasurer and two as president I can attest that it takes each member of the board to keep us going but we could not do it without our volunteer Executive Director, Gayle Vinchesi. Gayle has served Western Lane for 15 years as both a board member and our ED. She has the legacy knowledge that helps steer us and keeps us true to our mission. It's Gayle's support that has been invaluable to me as I took on both the Treasurer's and the President's role. The gratification of having worked with such an amazing group of people over the last six years is a memory I will cherish. WLCF AWARDS OVER \$100,000 TO LOCAL NON-PROFITS

Sandy Kuhlman, WLCF President, announced that over 20 non-profit organizations will be receiving over \$100,000 for the WLCF 2023/2024 grant cycle. These funds represent WLCF's ongoing mission of supporting projects or programs providing needed services or facilities for which public funds are not available, or insufficient, and to contribute to the cultural, economic, educational, or social betterment of our community. Their intent is to award large enough sums to make a significant and visible impact on a demonstrated need in our Western Lane community. On July 18th, 2023 at a meeting of the Rotary Club of Florence, grants were awarded to the following organizations:

A Grant Story UPRIVER REACH

During the 2023 grant cycle, Western Lane Community Foundation (WLCF) received a significant number of requests from the upriver community, including Mapleton and Deadwood, and ultimately awarded grants to five Mapleton nonprofit organizations or school district programs and supported two requests from Deadwood Creek Services (DCS). A total of \$18,150 was awarded in Mapleton, and \$6,825 was awarded in Deadwood.

Previous WLCF grant funds awarded to DCS were used to enhance the Deadwood Community Center, a gathering place for all manner of community activities. Funds this year allowed for the completion of an adjacent youth playground (see photo). We are heartened by the increased representation in these small Western Lane communities and encourage continuing participation.

Representatives from DCS offered the following feedback when queried how this year's (and previous) WLCF grant awards will impact the Upriver community. "Generous funding from WLCF continues to have a positive impact on the Deadwood community. Upgrades to our Deadwood Community Center facilities, including an improved covered porch and new playground equipment for our youth, will continue to serve our community for many years to come. WLCF funding is instrumental in two projects that are currently engaging diverse members of our upriver community: the revitalization of our Community Center's grounds and funding towards our local oral history & and archives project.
